

RING SIZING GUIDE (printed on A4 paper size)

Before measuring, please make sure that your printer settings are as follows:

- The fit to page option is unmarked
- The scale to fit option is unmarked
- \cdot Page is scaled to 100%

To make sure that the sizer is correct, take a ruler and line it up with the ruler below. If it measures 50mm or 2 inches, it is correct and you may proceed to measure your finger. Otherwise, check your printer settings and, once adjusted, continue with the steps below.



General Guidance


To find your correct ring size, it is best to measure the finger on which you intend to wear the ring towards the end of the day, preferably at normal room temperature. If you are between two ring sizes, we recommend that you opt for the larger size. To convert from EU to US sizes, please refer to the ring size chart below.

To determine the size of your new JEWELSOPHY ring, you may use one of the methods below:

Method A: Use an Existing Ring


- Adjust your printer settings as described above.
- Place your ring over the circles until you find the circle that has the closest fit with your ring.
- The inner edge of your current ring should fit on the outer edge of the circle. If the black line appears when you place your ring over the circle, this is your ring size. This is the inside circumference, which corresponds to the EU ring size.
- In order to double check your measurements, place your ring over the next larger circle, and you should not be able to see the black lines inside the circle (indicating that the size is too big).





Method B: Use the Ring Sizer

- Print the ring sizer following the instructions above for page scaling.
- Take a scissor and carefully cut out the ring sizer. Also cut along the dotted line just below the JEWELSOPHY logo.
- Wrap the sizer around your finger, with the numbers facing up, making sure that you have enough room to fit your ring over your knuckle as you slide it on.
- Pull the sizer through the slit or opening until it is comfortably snug around your finger, without it being too tight.
- The number that is in line with the edge of the slit of the ring sizer is your ring size.
- Refer to the ring size chart and choose the ring size that is the closest to the number you recorded with the ring sizer.





Method C: Use a Piece of Paper or String

- Use a piece of paper or string and wrap it around your finger, making sure that you have enough room to fit your ring over your knuckle as you slide it on.
- Mark the spot where the two ends of the paper or string meet and use a ruler to measure the length in millimeters (mm).
- This length is the circumference of your finger, which corresponds to EU ring sizing.
- To convert from EU to US sizes, please refer to the ring size chart.

BRACELET SIZING GUIDE (printed on A4 paper size)

Before measuring, please make sure that your printer settings are as follows:


- The fit to page option is unmarked

- Page is scaled to 100%

To make sure that the sizer is correct, take a ruler and line it up with the ruler below. If it measures 50mm or 2 inches, it is correct and you may proceed to measure your finger. Otherwise, check your printer settings and, once adjusted, continue with the steps below.



Method A: Use The Bracelet Sizer

- Print the bracelet sizer following the instructions above for page scaling.
- Take a scissor and carefully cut out the bracelet sizer.
- Also cut along the dotted line just below the JEWELSOPHY logo.
- Wrap the sizer around your wrist, with the numbers facing up (if ordering bangles, make sure that you have enough room to fit your bracelet over your fist as you slide it on) and pull the sizer through the slit or opening until it is comfortable around your wrist.
- The number that is in line with the edge of the slit of the bracelet sizer is the circumference of your wrist. This is your bracelet size in centimeters.
- Refer to the bracelet size chart and choose the bracelet size that is the closest to the number you recorded with the bracelet sizer.





Method B: Use a Piece of Paper or String

- Use a piece of paper or string and wrap it around your wrist, (if ordering bangles, make sure that you have enough room to fit your bracelet over your fist as you slide it on).
- Mark the spot where the two ends of the paper or string meet and use a ruler to measure the length in centimeters (cm).
- Refer to the chart below using your wrist measurements to find the size of your JEWELSOPHY bracelet.



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NECKLACE & PENDANT SIZE GUIDE

As the exact position of where a necklace or pendant falls differs depending on one's body type, we recommend that you use a ruler to measure a necklace you currently own, and compare it against the sizing guide below in order to determine where the JEWELSOPHY pendant or necklace you order will fall on your neck.



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
